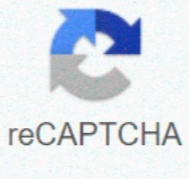

Brooke from dance moms now

Dance Moms star turned tween queen Jojo Siwa came to the defense of their former dance instructor when Brooke Hyland posted a shady TikTok about her current relationship with Abby Lee. In the since-deleted clip, which can be viewed here, Brooke says she got a new Facebook friend suggestion from Abby Lee before turning the camera to shake her head and cringe. "It's one thing to just not add her back," Jojo commented, adding, "It's another to post it..." As fans of Dance Moms will remember, Brooke and her younger sister Paige Hyland cut ties with the competitive dance studio and reality TV series after their mom Kelly Hyland got into a physical altercation with Abby Lee. Their dynamic got so tumultuous in 2014, that Abby Lee pressed charges against Kelly, which were ultimately dismissed. Kelly then filed two lawsuits (one of which sought \$5 million in damages) against Miller and Collins Avenue Entertainment, alleging emotional distress, breach of contract, defamation, and assault. By 2015, Abby Lee and Kelly had settled their legal drama. Jojo is one of the few Dance Moms stars who remain loyal to Abby Lee so many years later. Jojo Siwa Turns 17! How the Teen Star Made It BigShe told Us Weekly in a recent interview, "I think Abby got hurt by a lot of people and it's really, really, really sad that a lot of the people don't talk to her anymore." "The same thing with a lot of the producers from Dance Moms. It's just sad because Abby really is a good person," the teen explained. "Even though you see her yelling and screaming at children on TV, like Abby made seven stars. I wouldn't be doing this if it wasn't for her. Maddie and Mackenzie [Ziegler] wouldn't be where they are today without Abby." Referencing her legal battles and health issues, Jojo added, "She's gone through it in these last years, and she doesn't have that many people. It's just sad. I try to be there for everybody, you know? There's enough love!" Brooke, however, has not addressed Jojo's clap back. One year ago, "Dance Moms" premiered its eighth season on Lifetime. Alongside the return of coach Abby Lee Miller came several new faces to the long-running series-- a noticeably big change in the cast of dancers from Season 1's lineup. In honor of the anniversary of the show's most recent premiere, take a look at what the competition program's original Abby Lee Dance Company members are doing now in 2020.Maddie ZieglerAbby's former favorite student may no longer be an ALDC dancer but she's still in the business of entertainment. After quitting "Dance Moms" in 2016, Maddie went on to star in the feature film "The Book of Henry" while continuing to lead music videos for pop star Sia. This past year, she was featured in Netflix's "To All the Boys I've Loved Before" sequel and has a role in Steven Spielberg's upcoming "West Side Story" movie. Maddie, now 17, is also a partner with Fabletics. On her YouTube channel Kenzie, the 16-year-old posts everything from Q&A videos to dance tutorials. Her most popular videos, however, are her music videos. Mackenzie's official video for her 2017 single "Breathe" currently sits at over 33M views on the platform. She is majoring in creative writing and marketing at Pepperdine University in California. When she's not busy with her school work, she frequently posts to her social media pages, all of which are linked below. As for her entertainment career, Chloe most recently starred in the family drama "The Message."Nia SiouxNia has starred in several projects since she last appeared on "Dance Moms." In 2018-19, she had a recurring role on the soap "The Bold and the Beautiful" playing Emma Barber. From there, she went on to play Lily in the TV series "Sunnyside Up." She also has two films that are currently in post-production, "The Lies I Tell Myself" and "IM/Mortal." Like her former co-stars, Nia, 18, is big on social media and has 5.2M followers on TikTok where she frequently does callbacks to her "Dance Moms" days. Dance is also a featured topic in her upcoming book "Today I Dance," which follows a "simple story centered around the all-important message of inclusion." As for her education, Nia announced in May that she is planning to attend the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA). Instagram- niasiouxFilmMagic It's crazy to think Dance Moms first graced our television screens back in 2011, and Maddie Ziegler, Chloe Lukasiak, Nia Frazier and more cast members were introduced as young girls in Abby Lee Miller's class. These days, they're all grown up and have changed so much. Abby's controversial teaching method, which is extremely intense and focuses on the teammates competing against one another, makes for great television but has created a strained relationship with many of her former students. Maddie, one of Abby's most successful protégés, exclusively told Life & Style in April 2019 that she's "not in contact" with her former coach. Chloe detailed her tumultuous exit from the Abby Lee Dance Company during a YouTube video in January 2019, as well. "The beginning of season 4, I got kicked out of the dance studio. I was still on the show, and my former dance teacher couldn't kick me off the show because she didn't have that power or ability," the Center Stage star explained. "I got kicked out of the studio because to be part of her studio you had to sign a contract. A few of the main reasons I, well my mom, wouldn't sign is because it said stuff like you couldn't gain or lose five to 10 pounds. ... She also wanted 10 percent of the money I made, and I wasn't willing to agree to that." Sadly, her tense relationship with Abby and leaving the studio made things "really awkward" between Chloe and her dance pals. "Season 4 was probably the hardest for me to go through," she said. In 2017, Nia was the last original cast member left and the "only" dancer "who didn't break her contract early." Teen Vogue reported at the time. However, she left the show after season 7. "I was just like, I'm 16 now, I'm growing up, the show has been a great platform, but it's time to move on," she said about her exit from the reality show. "During the show, I couldn't take all the opportunities that I wanted to, and now since I'm off the show I'm getting to do what I want to do." The cast has come a long way.
